Lamb Starter / Grower

Young lambs can be introduced to concentrate feed when they are about 7 days old. Start by feeding small amounts to make sure the feed is always fresh, and to allow the digestive system time to adjust. Discard any stale feed that hasn't been eaten. Supplementary feeding will be particularly important if the ewe isn't getting much grass or producing enough milk.

For use later in the season as a feed to improve the finish on late season lambs when forage is in short supply. Introduce gradually and feed up to 1kg per head per day.

Feeding Guide

Ewes: Commence feeding 0.25kg per head per day to ewes 6 weeks prior to lambing. Slowly increase until 1kg per head per day is fed, some 2 weeks before lambing. Continue feeding after lambing until grass is plentiful. Actual feeding levels will depend on ewe condition, weather and the number of lambs expected /born.

Lambs: Supplement grazing/forage with 0.25-1kg per head per day.

Calves: Feed up to 2-3kg in two feeds according to available roughage and growth rate required.

Rearing Cattle: Feed up to 3-4kg in the first Winter and up to 4kg in the second Winter.

Finishing Cattle: Feed up to 5kg according to available roughage and growth rate required.

Additional Information

Store Farmgate feed in a cool dry place. Fresh, clean water should be available at all times together with quality forage, hay or straw.



Sheep Mix

Fed at up to 0.5kg a day this can be used as a maintenance diet and is suitable for ewes and rams, as well as for lambs from 5 weeks onwards. It can also be used to improve lambs that are reared for breeding purposes.

Ewe Nuts

Together with good quality hay or silage, this will provide the ewe with all the essential protein, digestible energy and vitamins and minerals that she requires for healthy lambs. Ewes in poor condition should be fed Ewe Nuts or Sheep Mix, with the quantities gradually increased prior to tupping. As a guide, start with about 0.25kg per head per day, two weeks before tupping, and build up to about 0.5kg per day, tailing off again after tupping (this technique is known as 'flushing').

In most cases ewes will need to be fed either Ewe Nuts or Sheep Mix from 6-8 weeks before lambing, and certainly in the 4 week period leading up to lambing. Introduce Ewe Nuts at a level of 0.25kg / head / day, and build up to a maximum of 1kg / head / day before lambing. Be careful not to overfeed young ewes or those lambing for the first time as this could produce lambing difficulties. Over fat ewes should be monitored and put on limited grazing.

Fed at up to 0.5kg a day these can be used as a maintenance diet. After weaning, ewes should be kept on a low plain of nutrition with concentrates kept to a minimum or cut out completely, depending on availability of grass and condition of the ewe.
